

Circle K has entered an agreement to purchase property at 28050 Sheldon Road, Brook Park OH 44142 located at the northwest corner of Sheldon Road and SR 237.

The 2.6 acre property is currently developed and operated as Donte's Restaurant and Pizza Shop which offers carry-out food, inside dining and outside dining service. The restaurant building is approximately 8,300 sf in size. The business has an approximately 130 ft wide driveway opening on Sheldon Road and a 15 ft wide driveway on SR 237. The property is well maintained, has adequate exterior lighting and parking area and is served by public utilities. A solid fence provides screening to the adjacent residential properties along the western property line. The property is bordered on the west by single family residences and on the north by a commercial construction company. The SR 237 and Sheldon Road intersection is a signalized intersection.

Circle K intends to demolish the existing restaurant and parking areas and construct a new 3962sf convenience store, new overhead fueling canopy with dispensers as well as associated parking and drive areas, site lighting and landscaping. Customers will benefit from the fresh food and beverage items as well as prepackaged items offered in the store. Spacious drive areas and easy access to the fueling locations will provide safe and convenient maneuverability within the site. The use is similar in nature to adjacent uses at the intersection and will offer customers added convenience while traveling. The project will require a significant financial investment in the property. As a corporately owned and operated store, the facility will be well maintained by Circle K and will not decrease adjacent property values.

Please find below comments regarding the final draft of the Traffic Impact Study (TIS) dated May 2024, prepared for Colliers Engineering and Design for the proposed Circle K Gas Station Project located at 20850 Sheldon Road:

- 1. The purpose of the Study "is to analyze the vehicular operating conditions in the vicinity of the proposed development both before and after its construction to determine what, if any, impact the project will have on the surrounding roadway network."
- 2. Actual turning movement traffic counts were conducted on February 7, 2024...
- 3. Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) Trip Generation Manual was utilized to predict traffic to/from the proposed development.
- 4. The study assumed that most of the site customers are "familiar with the area and that patrons intending to continue north on SR 237 will utilize the Site Drive #3 at Kolthoff Road to access SR-237 NB instead of turning left onto Sheldon Road then another left at SR-237...." In the event this Project moves forward, I recommend the Traffic Impact Study be revised to exclude this assumption.
- 5. "No-Build" and "Build" traffic data was analyzed using Highway Capacity Software (HCS).
- 6. Level of Service (LOS) = A, B, C, D, E are generally considered acceptable within a Metropolitan area. LOS of F is considered unacceptable.
- 7. The "No-Build" analysis indicated that 1 out of the 13 PM intersection/movements resulted in a LOS of F (unacceptable) and an overall "Intersection Delay" of LOS C for AM traffic movements and LOS D for PM traffic movements. (Table 2 on Page 7 of the TIS)
- 8. The "Build" analysis indicated that 4 out of the 13 AM intersection/movements resulted in a LOS of F (unacceptable) and 4 out of the 13 PM intersection/movements resulted in a LOS of F. An "Intersection Delay" of LOS F for AM and LOS F for PM are also predicted in the "Build" analysis of the Study. (Table 2 on Page 7 of the TIS)

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SR-237 / Site Drive #2								
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9. Report Summary and Recommendations (Item 9 on Page 11 of the TIS):

"In order to mitigate the LOS deficiencies at the SR-237/Sheldon Road intersection associated with the construction of the Circle K, some improvements will be required. These improvements include constructing northbound and southbound left-turn lanes, in addition to implementing northbound and southbound left-turn protected phase. These improvements will require roadway widening and realignment of SR-237, in addition to reconstruction of the traffic signal at the SR-237 / Sheldon Road intersection."

10. Roadway improvements recommended within an updated Study will be subject to approval by the City of Brook Park and potentially the City of Berea. Recommend that SR237/Sheldon Road roadway/intersection improvements be implemented in conjunction with the Circle K Project.

WHEREAS; the City of Brook Park entered into a regional Stormwater Management Program Service (SMP Service Agreement) as evidenced by Ordinance No. 10032-2016, passed August 2, 2016 and

WHEREAS, as a component of implementing a regional stormwater management program a "Community Cost-Share Account" has been created; and

WHEREAS, the Community Cost-Share Account is to provide funding to assist the City of Brook Park with the District approved project; and

whereas, the District supports the Community Cost-Share project proposed by the City of Brook Park to clean approximately 300 stormwater catch basins and dispose of the approximately 400 cubic yards of materials. The City will use BFI Lorain Co. Landfill to test and dispose of the solid waste that is removed from the catch basins. The catch basin cleaning will be done during the spring and fall of 2024 and be completed by December 2024; and

WHEREAS, the City will street sweep approximately 500 miles of City streets three times during 2024; the City will use City equipment and personnel to complete the work. The City will use BFI Lorain Landfill to test and dispose of the solid waste that is removed from the City streets; and

WHEREAS, no permits will be required to complete the work, the materials will be tested by BFI to make sure it is appropriate for disposal in a solid waste facility and not a hazardous waste facility, and the work being performed will also satisfy the City's SWMP under 2015-2019 MS4 Permit obligations; and

WHEREAS, the NEORSD will reimburse funds up to \$70,000.00 to the City for this project.

SECTION 2: The money needed for the aforesaid transaction shall be paid from Fund 100.

SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREAS, the District, as a component of implementing a regional stormwater management program, manages a financial account termed the "Community Cost-Share Account" that is for the aggregation and dissemination of funds derived from revenues collected from the Stormwater Fee; and

WHERAS, the purpose of the Community Cost-Share Account is to provide funding to assist the City with District-approved projects through the Community Cost-Share Program; and

WHEREAS, the Community Cost-Share Program funds are used for construction, operation, and reministrative costs directly associated with such projects as well as costs related to repair or ungrade; and

WHEREAS, the District supports the Community Cost-Share application for Hundale Drainage Improvements project (the "Project") as a Community Cost-Share project proposed by the City; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the payment and the mutual promises contained in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

Article L.O City Obligations

- 1.1 The City agrees to perform as follows:
 - 1.1.1 Complete work as detailed in the District approved Community Cost-Share application (Exhibit "C")
 - 1.1.2 Complete and submit Progress Reports when submitting Request for Payment as acceded, or within 30 days of close of the Project, per Section 5.0 of the Community Cost-Share Program Policy.

- 1.1.1 Notify the City's Watershed Team Leader at least 7 business days prior to the start of the Project.
- 1.1.4 Meet with District staff when requested to review the Project status.
- 1.1.5 Obtain all necessary legal agreements with affected property owners to perform the Project and to bind any successor in title to maintain compliance as specified in this Agreement between the District and City for the Project.
- 1.1.6 Comply with all applicable local, state and federal requirements. This may include, but is not limited to, U.S. Army Corp of Engineers Section 404, Ohio EPA Section 401 water quality certification, and Ohio Department of Natural Resources Dan Safety Laws.
- 1.1.7 If the City fails to maintain the Project in accordance with this Agreement, the City shall be fable for the full amount of any Community Cost-Share Project. Such amount shall be offset against the City Community Cost-Share Accord.

- 1.1.11 Permit the District to photograph the Project and to incorporate the Project into the District's overall public education and outreach efforts for stormwater management.
- £2 Failure to meet any of the requirements listed in Article 1.1 may result in termination of this Agreement and reimbursement of dishursed funds to the District.

Article 2.0 District's Obligations

WHEREAS, the Code of Regulations of the Mortheast Ohio Regional Sewer District, Title V — Stormwater Management Code Chapter 9 outlines the Community Cost-Share Program developed to provide funds to District Member Communities for construction, operation and maintenance activities of community-specific stormwater management projects; and

WHEREAS, under the Community Cost-Share Program, 25% of the annual collected stormwater revenue from each Member Community will be held by the District in a Community Cost-Share account, whereby Communities, with review and approval by the District, through specific applications outlining the community-specific stormwater work to be performed can access reimbursement of their funds; and

WHEREAS, the District is seeking authority to enter into Regional Stormwater Management Program Community Cost-Share Program Agreements with Member Communities for the purpose of detailing and memorializing responsibilities of the District and Member Communities under specific applications to the Community Cost-Share Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE NORTHEAST OHIO REGIONAL SEWER DISTRICT:

Section 1. That this Board finds that for the reasons stated in the preamble hereof it is in the best interests of the District to enter into Regional Stormwater Management Program Cost-Share Program Agreements with Member Communities to memorialize responsibilities of the District and Member Communities under specific applications to the Community Cost-Share Program.

Section 2. That this Board hereby authorizes the Executive Director to enter into Regional Stormwater Management Program Cost-Share Agreements with Member Communities to memorialize responsibilities of the District and Member Communities under specific applications to the Community Cost-Share Program under such terms and conditions that are satisfactory to the Director of Law and in the best interests of the District.


