AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE TEMPORARY APPROPRIATIONS OF THE CITY OF BROOK PARK, STATE OF OHIO, FOR THE THREE MONTHS ENDING ON MARCH 31, 2025, AND DELCARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, to appropriate funds to meet current expenses of the said City for the three month period ending March 31, 2025.

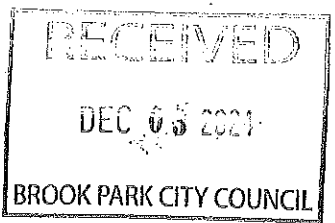
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio that:

SECTION 1: That to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the City of Brook Park, Ohio for the three month ending on March 31, 2025, there be appropriated the total of \$16,779,426.64 as shown in Sections 2 thru 5 of this ordinance.

SECTION 2: The attached Exhibit "A" provides detail of expenditures for the three month ending March 31, 2025.

SECTION 3: A copy of this Ordinance shall be submitted by the Director of Finance to the Fiscal Officer of Cuyahoga County, Ohio and upon certification by said Fiscal Officer as required by law, the Director of Finance of this City is hereby authorized to draw his warrants upon the City Finance Department for payment of any certification and vouchers therefore approved by the proper officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an Ordinance of the Council to make such expenditures; provided, however, that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with the law or the Ordinance of this Council.

SECTION 4: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all



deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**SECTION 5:** This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of said City, and for the further reason of the fact that funds must be made available and be appropriated to provide for the current expenses and payments thereof for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2025; therefore, provided this ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected to council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.



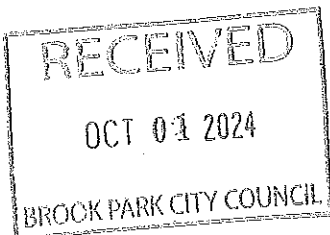

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: Section 1805.01(h) of the Brook Park Codified Ordinances, passed by Ordinance No. 9984-2015, passed December 15, 2015, amended by Ordinance 10067-2017, passed March 7, 2017, amended by Ordinance 11012-2018, passed January 23, 2018, and amended by Ordinance 11375-2023, passed December 12, 2023 and reading as follows:

1805.01(h) Collection at Source.

- (h) On or before the last day of February of each year, an employer shall file a withholding reconciliation return with the Tax Director listing the names, addresses, and social security numbers of all employees from whose qualifying wages tax was withheld or should have been withheld for the City of Brook Park during the preceding calendar year, the amount of tax withheld, if any, from each such employee's qualifying wage, the total amount of qualifying wages paid to such employee during the preceding calendar year, the name of every other municipal corporation for which tax was withheld or should have been withheld from such employee during the preceding calendar year, and any other information required for federal income tax reporting purposes on Internal Revenue Service form W-2 or its equivalent form with respect to such employee, and other information as may be required by the Tax Director.



Is hereby amended to read:

(h) On or before the last day of February of each year, any person, including corporation, partnerships, employers, estates and trusts, who files 10 or more information returns of form W-2 for any calendar year, must file these returns electronically using the EFW2 Format and Guidelines prescribed by the Social Security Administration and the Internal Revenue Service (EFW2). Employers issuing 9 or less forms W-2 or 1099-NEC are encouraged, but not required to remit W-2 forms electronically or such other process as determined acceptable to the Director of Finance. All requirements apply separately to both original and corrected forms. In addition to the above wage reporting requirements, any person paying money to an individual or independent contractor shall report such payment. The information should be reported on Federal Form 1099 and filed yearly with the Tax Director on or before February 28<sup>th</sup>. Any return not so filed shall be subject to a penalty in accordance with Section 1801.01 of this Chapter.

**SECTION 2:** Former Section 1805.01(h) of the Brook Park Codified Ordinances, passed by Ordinance No. 9984-2015, passed December 15, 2015, amended by Ordinance 10067-2017, passed March 7, 2017, amended by Ordinance 11012-2018, passed January 23, 2018, and amended by Ordinance 11375-2023, passed December 12, 2023 is hereby expressly repealed, as of December 31, 2024 and new Section 1805.01(h) shall become effective on January 1, 2025.

**SECTION 4:** This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for the further reason to amend Section 1805.01(h) of the Brook Park Codified Ordinances therefore provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force on January 1, 2025.

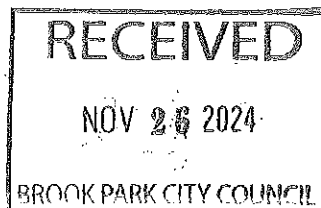

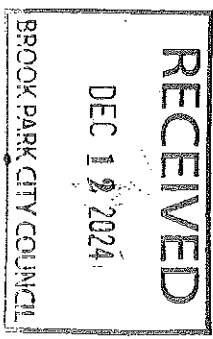
NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: Section 351.03 of the Brook Park Codified Ordinances, as enacted by Ordinance No. 2570-1966, passed January 31, 1966, and amended by Ord. 9826-2013, passed April 2, 2013 and reading as follows:

**351.03 PROHIBITED STANDING OR PARKING PLACES.**

(a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or comply with the provisions of this Traffic Code, or while obeying the directions of a police officer or traffic-control device, in any of the following places:

- (1) On a sidewalk or tree lawn, except a bicycle;
- (2) In front of a public or private driveway;
- (3) Within an intersection;
- (4) Within 10 feet of a fire hydrant;
- (5) On a crosswalk;
- (6) Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;
- (7) Within 30 feet of, and upon the approach to, any flashing beacon, stop-sign, or traffic control device;
- (8) Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb within 30 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by a traffic-control device;
- (9) Within 50 feet of the nearest rail or railroad crossing;  
Within 20 feet of a driveway entrance to any fire station



- (10) and, on the side of the street opposite the entrance to any fire station, within 75 feet of the entrance when it is properly posted with signs;
- (11) Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when such standing or parking would obstruct traffic;
- (12) Alongside any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
- (13) Upon any bridge or elevated structure upon a highway, or within a highway tunnel;
- (14) At any place where signs prohibit stopping and/or parking;
- (15) Within one foot of another parked vehicle;
- (16) On the roadway portion of a freeway, expressway, or thruway.
- (17) In any private driveway. Alleyway or areaway between buildings, when in the opinion of the Fire Chief, such parking constitutes a fire hazard or an obstruction or interference with the operation of fire equipment.
- (18) In any parking area reserved for handicapped persons.

(b) A person is permitted, without charge or restriction, to stand or park on a sidewalk a motor-driven cycle or motor scooter that has an engine not larger than 150 cubic centimeters, a low-speed micromobility device, or a bicycle or electric bicycle, provided that the motor-driven cycle, motor scooter, low-speed micromobility device, bicycle, or electric bicycle does not impede the normal flow of pedestrian traffic. This division does not authorize any person to operate a vehicle in violation of R.C. § 4511.711, or any substantially equivalent municipal ordinance.

(c) Except as otherwise provided in this division, whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor. If, within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to one predicate motor vehicle or traffic offense, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. If, within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of two or more predicate motor vehicle or traffic offenses, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree.

Is hereby amended to read:

**351.03 PROHIBITED STANDING OR PARKING PLACES.**

(a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or comply with the provisions of this Traffic Code, or while obeying the directions of a police officer or traffic-control device, in any of the following places:

- (1) On a sidewalk or tree lawn, ~~except a bicycle,~~ **except as provided in division (b) of this section;**
- (2) In front of a public or private driveway;
- (3) Within an intersection;
- (4) Within 10 feet of a fire hydrant;
- (5) On a crosswalk;
- (6) Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;
- (7) Within 30 feet of, and upon the approach to, any flashing beacon, stop sign, or traffic-control device;
- (8) Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by a traffic-control device;
- (9) Within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing;
- (10) Within 20 feet of a driveway entrance to any fire station and, on the side of the street opposite the entrance to any fire station, within 75 feet of the entrance when it is properly posted with signs;
- (11) Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when such standing or parking would obstruct traffic;

(12) Alongside any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;

(13) Upon any bridge or elevated structure upon a highway, or within a highway tunnel;

(14) At any place where signs prohibit stopping and/or parking, or at any place in excess of the maximum time limited by signs;

(15) Within one foot of another parked vehicle;

(16) On the roadway portion of a freeway, expressway, or thruway.

(17) In any private driveway, alleyway or areaway between buildings, when in the opinion of the Fire Chief, such parking constitutes a fire hazard or an obstruction or interference with the operation of fire equipment.

(18) In any individual parking space designated for handicapped parking unless the vehicle bears a valid parking permit for handicapped persons and is being driven by or used at the time for transportation of handicapped person.

(b) A person is permitted, without charge or restriction, to stand or park on a sidewalk a motor-driven cycle or motor scooter that has an engine not larger than 150 cubic centimeters, a low-speed micromobility device, or a bicycle or electric bicycle, provided that the motor-driven cycle, motor scooter, low-speed micromobility device, bicycle, or electric bicycle does not impede the normal flow of pedestrian traffic. This division does not authorize any person to operate a vehicle in violation of R.C. § 4511.711, or any substantially equivalent municipal ordinance.

(c) Except as otherwise provided in this division, whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor. AN ORDINANCE  
 AMENDING SECTION 141.02  
 OF THE BROOK PARK CODIFIED ORDINANCES  
 ENTITLED 'COMPOSITION: EXECUTIVE HEAD,'

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: Section 141.02 of the Brook Park Codified Ordinances is hereby amended to read:

**141.02 COMPOSITION; EXECUTIVE HEAD.**

(a) The Police Department shall consist of a Police Chief and not more than forty-three regular police officers.

(b) There is hereby established within the Police Department one Police Chief, one Police Captain, not less more than ~~six~~ **four** Police Sergeants, and not less ~~more~~ than ~~one~~ **four** Police Lieutenants and a Detective Bureau. Such officers shall be appointed by the Director of Public Safety from the regular full-time membership of the Police Department.

(c) Under the direction of the Mayor, the Director of Public Safety shall be the executive head of the Police Department. He shall have all powers and duties connected with and incident to the appointment, regulation and government of such Department, except as otherwise provided by law.

SECTION 2: Former Section 141.02 of the Brook Park Codified Ordinances as enacted by Ordinance No. 2650-1966, passed November 1, 1966, Ordinance No. 5715-1980 passed March 4, 1980, Ordinance No. 8664-2009, passed October 20, 2009, Ordinance No. 11101-2019, passed July 2, 2019, and Ordinance No. 11106-2019, passed July 22, 2019, is hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


