The meeting was called to order by Council President Salvatore at 7:30 p.m., the clerk called the roll and the following Members of Council answered:

**REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:**

Aviation & Environmental Committee – Chairman, Dufour

Mr. Dufour reported there is no legislation in committee. In February Cleveland Hopkins International Airport welcomed 700,000 passengers, a 9.55 increase versus same period in 2023 and year to date passengers are up eight-percent (8%) and three-percent (3%) from 2019.

Board of Zoning Appeals - Chairman, Mencini

Mr. Mencini reported at last night's meeting two (2) requests were on the agenda. First being a variance for an addition to an existing garage - approved. Second was for a variance for installation of a nine-foot (9) fence - approved.

Finance Committee - Chairman, Scott

Mr. Scott reported no legislation on agenda. The Board of Control had three (3) meetings since last report; March 22nd, March 26th and April 2nd. Three (3) largest for March 22nd were attorney services for City of Cleveland verses City of Brook Park - \$28,031.11; Asphalt sealer and paint for several locations of the city - \$44,000.00 and Game Time for Kennedy Park new playground equipment - 277,688.72. March 26th three largest pavement striping different city locations - \$46,411.25; Concrete Pete decorative concrete - Snow Road - \$17,000.00 and truck repairs - \$3,300.00. April 2nd three (3) largest Tri-Technologies - \$10,500.00; Wedo storm basin - \$14,525.00 and miscellaneous batteries for various department - \$5,000.00.

Legislative Committee - Chairman, Scott

Mr. Scott reported two (2) items on tonight's agenda.

Parks & Recreation Committee - Chairman, McCorkle

Mr. McCorkle reported spring basketball and volleyball kicked off this week. The Spring into the Park event was very well attended. The next meeting will be April 18th.

Planning Committee - Co-Chairman, McCorkle

Mr. McCorkle reported the Planning commission met yesterday with two (2) items on the agenda. First being a request for a conditional use permit for operation of an auto facility at 6410 Eastland Road - passed unanimously. Second request for aesthetic approval for a charging electric vehicle (EV) charging station at 6161 Engle Road - passed unanimously. One (1) item was removed from the table for a request for front porch aesthetic - passed unanimously. The second tabled item is a request for a conditional use permit for Circle K gas station located at 20850 Sheldon Road remains on table due to traffic study being done.

Safety Committee - Chairman, Troyer

Mr. Troyer reported the Safety committee has three (3) items on tonight's agenda.

Service Committee - Chairman, Roberts

Mr. Roberts reported the Service committee has two (2) items on tonight's agenda. Publicly thanked service worker Bernath for the recent tour of the service garage and surrounding outside grounds.

Southwest General Health Center Trustee, Mencini

Mr. Mencini reported Southwest will be coming out with new attractive logo's. The January nursing recruitment goal was 18% and reached 20%. Fundraising for January goal was \$125 million-dollars and exceeded to \$1.4 million-dollars. New developments the last few months was the recruitment of a Chief Information and Technology Officer; closure of the bariatric surgery program; new virtual investment program and working on a home therapy health care program. One major negative problem is the denial to pay claims from insurance companies.

Berea Board of Education Representative, McCorkle

Mr. McCorkle stated no report; next meeting will be April 18th.

Technology & Innovation Council Representative, Dufour

Mr. Dufour stated no report and mentioned Mayor Orcutt and I had a productive conversation with Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) Drive Ohio Program. Next meeting will be April 10th and in attendance will be Director from the Internet Crimes against children task force. Side-note the Citizen of the Year met and nominations are open for anyone who performs special needs, volunteer work or anything that sets them apart from an outstanding member of the community can be nominated. **Questions:**

Mr. Troyer asked for an update on the former BP gas station on Snow and Smith Roads?

Mayor Orcutt responded met with British Petroleum (BP) who has a deed restriction on that land through Cross-America Partners. BP will not lift the deed restriction and if the city tries to do anything with Eminent Domain the city was told by BP they would pursue litigation.

Mr. Troyer asked if anything can be done for removal of the building?

Mayor Orcutt responded will be having an executive session for purchase of land.

Mr. Mencini asked for an update on speeding and overnight parking?

Mayor Orcutt responded the department has adjusted schedules for certain personnel on different shifts for traffic control. With the overnight parking that is low on the priority list due to having officers at the dealerships on Brookpark Road and catching criminals. To have more overnight parking tickets written more dollars would have to be appropriated in order to do that.

Mr. Mencini thanked Mayor Orcutt for the tour of the natatorium area and stated that will cost money and bold decisions must be made.

Mr. McGann reported Ohio state law requires every six (6) years all counties perform a physical appraisal of parcels in each county. Cuyahoga County has 550,000 parcels and hopes to have field work done by the end of this month. The county will be having forums in each Council district, for a full list visit the county's website.
