Fire Safety Tips:

- Smoke alarms are your best early warning system in the event of fire. Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, including the basement, and outside each sleeping area. If you sleep with the door closed, install one inside your sleeping area as well.
- Plan Your Escape: Have an escape plan where everyone knows at least two unobstructed exits from every room. Decide on a meeting place outside.
- Matches & Lighters: Store them where kids can't see or reach them.



- Space Heaters: Keep portable heaters and space heaters at least three feet (one meter) away from anything that can burn. Keep children and pets away from heaters, and turn them off when you leave home or go to sleep.
- Crawl Low: If you must escape through smoke, crawl on your hands and knees and keep your head 12 to 24 inches above the floor, where the air will be cleaner.
- Stop, Drop, Cover your face and Roll: If your clothes catch fire, don't run.

Thank you to residents that assisted their neighbors. A special appreciation goes out to all city employees who organized under the unfavorable circumstances to


